INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Read greeting and consent information to woman:

Your household has been randomly selected. Some of the questions are **sensitive**, but all the information we obtain will remain **strictly confidential** and **your identity and answers will never be identified**. Your participation is strictly voluntary. If you choose to participate, you are not obliged to answer any question you don't want to, and you may withdraw from the interview at any time.
